## Topics and Speakers:

### Dr. Amy Adair

#### ***"Managing the Developing Dentition: Pearls from a Pediatric Dentist"***

This presentation reviews the most common "red flags" we encounter in the developing dentition. Participants will gain insight on knowing when to refer to an orthodontist or other specialist, as well as treatment options for managing problems in the developing dentition.

### Dr. Douglas Mahn

#### ***"Peri-Implantitis: Restorative Risk Factors"***

Implant disease occurs in up to 50% of implant patients and can result in irreversible bone loss, cosmetic disasters and loss of implants. Implant crown design greatly influences the risk of developing disease around implant sites. Relevant literature will be reviewed, and clinical cases will be shown. Attendees will understand the definition, etiology and prevalence of implant disease, as well as the implant crown designs that place implant sites at greater risk for disease. The goal is to give the doctor the ability to recognize current implant sites that are at risk and to make improvements in future crown design

### Dr. Niloofar Mofakhami

#### ***"Silver Diamine Fluoride" (SDF)***

SDF has been around for decades but has only been used widely in the US for the past 2 to 3 years. It is, however, significantly changing the way we practice dentistry. GPs should know about this product as they will see more and more young adults with this treatment on their permanent teeth once they transfer to general practices from their pediatric dentists. The history of SDF and its indication will be discussed, the advantages/disadvantages and instructions for its applications.

### Dr. Ali Nosrat

#### ***"Regenerative Endodontics - New Frontiers"***

Regenerative endodontic treatment (RET) (also known as Revitalization or Revascularization) is a new biologically-based treatment aimed to regenerate the dentin-pulp complex in teeth with endodontic disease. RET is mainly rendered in immature teeth with pulp necrosis. However, RET can potentially change the future of endodontic treatments in mature and immature teeth. This presentation reviews the history and biological basis of RET. Clinical and radiographic outcomes of several cases undergone RET will be presented. The presentation reviews the histological outcome of animal and human studies and discuss the types of tissues formed inside the root canal space following RET. A summary of the outcome of clinical studies will be presented and participants will become familiar with the survival and success rate of teeth undergone RET.

### Dr. Dipa Patel

#### ***"The Narcotic Crisis and the Role of Dental Providers – What YOU Can Do to Make an Impact!"***

*(This presentation meets the VA Board of Dentistry's 2-hour requirement on pain management)*

The narcotic crisis has settled into the fabric of our society and there does not seem to be any sign of relenting. This lecture will address the history of this epidemic - why Europe is not facing the crisis, the role of the pharmaceutical industry, as well as alternative methods for post-surgical pain control. It will also review new laws and regulations in VA pertaining to narcotic prescribing, use of the PMP, role of counseling/discussion with patients about responsible use of narcotic disposal, destigmatizing mental illness/addiction; new links between CYP enzymes and addictive liability.
